

The Presley Years at Southwestern Middle School

1992-2003

I was assigned as principal to Southwestern Middle School on July 1, 1992. Thus, I was excited to be the principal and anxious to meet the staff and students. One of my goals was to help the school develop an outstanding academic program that would be exciting to the students as well as the total community. In addition, I wanted the students to be proud to attend an excellent school.

The first person that I met was Southwestern's icon and my secretary, Ms. Edith Shannon. She was my backbone throughout most of my years at the school.
